2022 Legislative Priorities

Highest Priorities

- Snoqualmie Parkway: Request state funding for Snoqualmie Parkway asphalt maintenance, estimated to cost over \$6 million for current repaving. The Parkway is used as an extension of SR 18 between I-90 and SR 202, connecting those two state highways and the interstate. This traffic accounts for over 80% of the wear and tear on the Parkway, and thus warrants state funding.
- Community Center Expansion: Request state funding to help expand Snoqualmie's community center and add a swimming pool. This will address over-capacity issues at our community center and provide an opportunity for all children in our city the chance to learn to swim, so they will be safe when recreating in our rivers.

Other Priorities

- Prior Appropriations: Ensure continuation of prior legislative appropriations funding a portion of the City Riverwalk project through the Department of Commerce.
- SR 18 Widening (Issaquah Hobart Rd. – SR 18/I-90): Appropriate state funding for construction of SR 18 widening.
- Mental Health and Substance Abuse Treatment: Funding for mental health and substance abuse treatment services, including mental health navigator to work with local organizations and police department, and substance abuse disorder assessment and treatment services needed to implement SB 5476 (response to *State v. Blake*).
- Wildlife Preservation: Funding for wildlife (elk) crossing infrastructure and turn lane and pull out from the SR 202 for viewing elk.
- Housing Affordability: State funding to incentivize new development to increase housing affordability in the City of Snoqualmie through workforce housing and other affordable housing alternatives.
